The playground at the recreation field was subject to a spot inspection on 19th April which resulted in several of the apparatus being evaluated as unsafe and the playground being closed. These items have been removed and we were able to open what is left of the playground for the children to use. We hope to have the playground replaced before the summer holidays and due to this proposed work, it has been decided not to carry out repair work to the existing equipment in the meantime.
