The Parish Council organised for a final few days of gully clearing and flushing in the first week of December. Ably led by Cllr Tommy Tulk, the contractors re-visited areas they had previously cleared of roots, silt and other blockages to ensure free-flowing drains.

The gullies are now working around the school, although there is a bit of manual work to do in one of the holes where some roots need to be cut. The recent flooding there is due to the camber of the road which causes excessive run off.

The hospice is inviting brave fundraisers to throw on their fancy dress and take the plunge, all in the name in supporting local hospice care.

Those keen to push themselves even further can pair the Dip with the **Fire & Ice Challenge**, combining the New Year's Day plunge with February's Firewalk in Yeovil to earn the exclusive "Fire & Ice Champion" medal.

If you'd prefer to stay warm and toasty but still want to help out – the hospice also needs volunteers to help make the event a success!

Roles include registration, serving refreshments, and bucket collecting.
