Certainly a very positive start!

The children have enjoyed a busy Spring term, including trips to the Rural life museum in Glastonbury, Haynes motor museum and culminating in a 'Shakespeare' week with all the children performing parts of a play.

World book day was celebrated with the children bringing in potatoes decorated as a book character.

Recently the school Choir sang beautifully in the 'Festival of Song' at the Westlands entertainment venue and were highly praised for their performance.

Long Sutton Parish Council

Long Sutton Parish Council announced in the March 2023 a major improvement plan for the sports and leisure facilities in the parish, which is well underway. The tennis courts refurbishment is almost completed, and the play area refurbishment is scheduled for later this year.

In addition to increased costs experienced due to high inflation, the Parish Council has set aside a contingency budget for flood mitigation and other non-statutory services, that may be affected by the well documented and publicised financial situation at Somerset Council.
