VERY IMPORTANT

The Permissive Footpath at the top of the field belonging to Roger Coombs in Long Load is being abused by dog walkers and Mobility Scooter riders. So, just in case you are not aware please note the following:

The <u>ONLY FOOTPATH</u> in that field is adjacent to the road and runs between two pedestrian gates at the south end of the village.

People must stay on the footpath and **NOT** allow their dogs to run over the field.

Dog Faeces is dangerous to cattle and very unpleasant to the farmer who needs to cut his grass crop for feed. A Permissive Path is one granted kindly by the landowner and can be removed at any time. If the abuse persists the permissive footpath will be rescinded and there will be no safe access along that part of the road for children and other pedestrians. It just takes a little common country sense to realize that all fields belong to someone and is not a free for all. Please be aware of the countryside laws. Don't be the one to spoil it for everyone else! If you are able to volunteer help by clearing the path of weed etc, the PC would be very pleased to hear from you. Thank you!
